The permanent collection includes more than 4,000 works: vessels from Tang-dynasty China, early Italian paintings, Borneo textiles, American art treasures, West African art masks, modern & contemporary art, ancient sculptures, masterworks by Degas, van Gogh, and Picasso.

The current exhibitions include: David Goldblatt: No Ulterior Motive" and "Thinking Small: Dutch Art to Scale." The Goldblatt exhibition is a traveling retrospective of the 7 decades (1950-2010) of this South African photographer's career. The Dutch art exhibition includes objects and paintings from 17th century Netherlands in minute, meticulous detail.
